Founded in 1889, Pocatello has been recognized by *Forbes.com* as a "Best Small Place for Business" five years in a row, as well as ranked one of the "Top Ten Small Places to Move and Raise a Family" according the Primary Relocation and World ERC.

For nearly a century, Pocatello has been the home of Idaho State University (ISU) providing both rich educational and cultural opportunities for the entire region.

It is also a bedroom community for many employees associated with the nearby Idaho National Laboratory (INL); one of eleven U.S. Department of Energy facilities nationwide, as well as home to many other small high-technology companies.



Climate Information

Pocatello has a desirable four-season climate where clear, sunny, and dry is the norm. Less than 15 inches of precipitation falls annually. Summers are dry and warm with the average temperature at 92.4°. The average daily temperature during the winter months is 35.4°.

Cost of Living

The cost of living in Pocatello is 13% below the national average – \$48,612 for average household married with one child and \$73,965 for household married with two childred – as reported by *careertrends. com.* A median-priced home in Pocatello proper is less than \$132,500, 25% below the national average based on *areavibes.com.* Conservative new builds average approximately \$180,000 – \$220.000.





Portneuf Medical Center is a regional Level II trauma center with state-of-the-art cardiology and neurosurgery programs. We earned a five-star ranking in three cardiology and cardiac surgery programs. The Portneuf Cancer Center provides radiation and medical oncology services and has received commendations for clinical trial accrual, cancer registrar education, nursing care and data submission. Portneuf was designated a Blue Center of Distinction by Blue Cross for knee and hip replacement and spine surgery. Our Wound Care and Hyperbaric Center is ranked in the top 15% nationally for five consecutive years. Our urology program is nationally recognized and we have a Level II neonatal intensive care unit.

More importantly, however, we are concerned about what happens beyond our doors and how we can partner with our community. The Pocatello Sports Medicine Institute cares for our local athletes both on and off the field; Portneuf Quality Alliance, an innovative health care team, works with employers to manage and control the costs of healthcare; and our partner, Portneuf Health Trust, was visionary in establishing the Portneuf Wellness Complex.
